DAVID LIM, COMPETITION WINNER AND UPCOMING RECITALIST

Congratulations David Lim! Our Sioux Trails AGO Education Chair and Newsletter editor recently received first prize in the 12th annual Immanuel Lutheran Church Organ Competition in Evanston, Illinois. This competition, which seeks to promote interest in pipe organ and church music by young collegiate musicians, invites nominations for potential candidates from colleges and universities throughout the

nation. David performed the Prelude and Fugue in D major, BWV 532 by J. S. Bach, a setting of the American shape-note tune LAND OF REST by George Shearing, and the hymn "Comfort, Comfort, Now My People" (ELW 256). In the letter relaying congratulations to David, the competition committee stated that David's playing was both "skillful and interesting." As part of his award, David receives a \$2000 cash prize, a gold medal, and the invitation to return to Evanston to perform a full recital. David will perform that recital on Sunday, May 4.

David will also perform a full recital in Christ Chapel on the Gustavus Adolphus campus on Friday, April 11, at 7:30 p.m. This junior recital will include the *Prelude and Fugue in D major*, BWV 532, by J. S. Bach; *Sonata for Organ in A, No. 3* by Felix Mendelssohn; *Hymne au Soleil* and *Clair de Lune* (from 24 Pièces de fantaisie, op. 53) and Le jardin suspendu by Jehan Alain. All are invited to attend this free recital.
