REMARKS FROM THE CAVAILLE-COLL PRESENTATION

Chad Winterfeldt, our former Dean, presented excerpts from the video series about Aristide Cavaille Coll and his tremendous contribution to the development of the modern organ on the 19th of January. In this landmark series, many insights into the personality of Cavaille-Coll were presented alongside a good explanation of his primary contributions. The videography and the locations were outstanding enough to prompt a number of the twenty-some attendees to want to purchase the set for themselves. I was most impressed by the emphasis placed upon the Barker Lever and Cavaille-Coll's implementation of it in his instruments. And I was reminded again by the superb sound recording of the power of the French reeds and how the performer was enabled to prepare them and call them up when desired. One could easily describe this as the first major step to the development of registration pistons on the organ. Chad did a great job of condensing the series down to a Sunday afternoon size – enough to whet the appetites of those in attendance to travel opportunities and to reinforce our understanding of the literature we play, especially the French Romantic tradition.
