All recitals begin at 12:10 p.m. on consecutive Tuesdays during the summer. Each location offers ample parking, accessible entrances, and air-conditioning. A free-will donation will be collected to defray costs.

The series begins at Grace Lutheran Church, 320 E. Main St., Mankato, on Tuesday, June 12 and continues through July 10.
